LITURGY OF THE WORD

Daniel heard the word of the Lord describing an end time where those who sleep will either awake to life everlasting or to everlasting disgrace. In the second reading we hear that by Christ's one sacrifice, we are made perfect. In the Gospel, Jesus tells of the day that the Son of Man will come in glory to gather his elect.

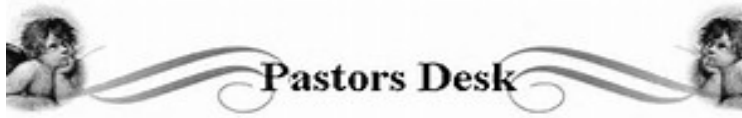

We had several meetings in the parish since May with the representative from The Gersh Academy and the Diocese. To date the Diocese has not been able to make a decision about us leasing the school. It is why I wrote this letter to Bishop Barres.

Dear Bishop Barres,

I am writing to inform you that we are very disappointed about how the Diocese is helping us with our school building. The school building has been empty for 12 years. The parish pays for the utilities and maintenance expenses from our weekly parish collections. Three years ago we tried to lease the school building, but do to the length of the lease term, we were denied by the Diocese.

In May, The Gersh Academy expressed interest in renting our school building. We have gone through all the proper channels through the Diocese. A letter was sent to Bishop Brennan on 6/27/2018 asking for permission to rent the school building. The Facilities Committee met on 9/18/2018 and gave their approval. The Finance Committee met on 10/11/2018 and gave their approval. Lastly, the College of Consultants met on 10/31/2018 and to date they have not made a decision. "It's on the table". This has been going on for 7 months since May 2018 and a decision still has not been made. What kind of workers do we have in our Chancery?

We are very grateful to Ken Morra who has been a tremendous help to the parish through this process.

The Gersh Academy has expressed their frustration with the length of this process and they are willing to walk away if a decision is not made by the Diocese within two weeks. Renting the school building will be a great financial support to the parish. We are unable to pay any of our financial obligations to the Diocese from the parish collections, because 80% of our parishioners are senior citizens who are on a fixed income. A negative decision by the Diocese in this case also has a negative financial impact on the Diocese as well as the parish.

I am sure you can understand the frustration of my parishioners, The Gersh Academy, and my frustration as a Pastor regarding this situation.

Please do something in this case as the head of the Diocese of Rockville Centre.
