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LITURGY OF THE WORD

In today's first reading, we hear Moses reminding us to observe the commandments of our Father, especially to love God first. In the second reading, we see Jesus as the perfect sacrifice who has redeemed us. And in today's Gospel, Jesus adds the second of the two greatest commandments: *to love your neighbor as yourself*.

GOD'S LAWS

God's laws are not intended to burden or torment us. Instead they are guideposts that point us in the direction of good living. Accordingly, good living requires loving God and loving one another. We should not follow God's laws out of fear of what might happen if we don't, but rather view them as a foundation for building relationships and trust with one another and with God. The *Shema* prayer of Orthodox Jews is based on the reading from Deuteronomy today, "Hear, O Israel." Every morning people recite the prayer as a profession of their love for God and pledge their obedience to God throughout the day. They pass on their love of God to their children, from one generation to the next.

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FAMILY CONNECTION

As Christians, our moral behavior is guided by the two-part commandment taught by Jesus in today's Gospel: love God and love your neighbor as yourself. Many of us learned to use this framework as an examination of conscience. By examining our lives through the lens of these commandments, we have learned that the challenge of these commandments is not in our desire to follow them but in our capacity to consistently honor these commandments in our daily lives.

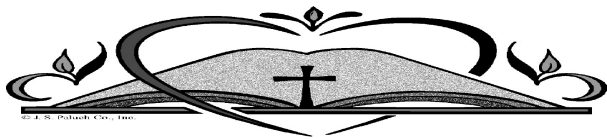

Umiejętność świętych

W czasie mszy świętej ku czci św. Jana Kantego, jednego z patronów Krakowa w modlitwie mszalnej pada sformułowanie: „Wszchemogący Boże, spraw, abyśmy za przykładem św. Jana Kantego, kapłana, doskonalili się w umiejętności świętych”. Ta liturgiczna modlitwa jest tym bardziej intrygująca, że nie sposób znaleźć odpowiedzi na to, czym owa „umiejętność świętych jest”. Skoro ten „Amicus” jest poświęcony talentom, przyjrzyjmy się zatem, posiłkując się Mszałem, czym owa umiejętność może być i jak ją można zdobyć.

Gdy patrzemy na modlitwy mszalne, zwłaszcza poświęcone świętym, zobaczymy tam następujące przyczyny ich świętości.

W Uroczystość Wszystkich Świętych usłyszymy, że czcimy mieszkańców nieba dlatego, że „w życiu doczesnym naśladowali Chrystusa”. We wspomnienie św. Agnieszki (21.01) prosimy o pomoc Bożą w naśladowaniu „stałości w wierze św. Agnieszki”, w dniu św. Bonawentury (15.07) błagamy o siłę, byśmy „naśladowali jego gorącą miłość”, zaś w dzień św. Jacka (17.08) prosimy, byśmy „naśladowali misterium Męki Pańskiej, które sprawujemy”.

Teksty mszalne, dając nam za wzór świętych, wielokrotnie są zachętą do naśladowania ich i Chrystusa Pana. Czy zatem by zostać świętym, trzeba być „podróbką”, „imitacją” czy może „sobowtorem świętego”? Czy na tym ma polegać owa „umiejętność świętych”? Czy zatem w mojej wierze, w moim powołaniu nie ma miejsca na oryginalność, na coś w pełni i absolutnie mojego, na moją indywidualność? Wręcz przeciwnie. Nie sposób znaleźć dwóch świętych, których życie byłoby takie samo. Jaka różnica jest choćby w życiu św. Piotra i Pawła: Różne temperamenty. Różne doświadczenie Chrystusa. Różne patrzenie na wspólnotę. Przy czym łatwo zgodzimy się, że obaj naśladowali Chrystusa i wspomnianą już Jego Mękę, a nie zarzucimy tym księżętom Kościoła jakiś „plagiat” świętości. Naśladowanie Chrystusa nie ma zatem być szarlatańskim „ctrl+c”, „ctrl+v”.

Ma być moim indywidualnym upodobaniem się do Pana, z zachowaniem moich talentów i umiejętności. A nawet nie tyle z zachowaniem, co z rozwijaniem.
