### SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

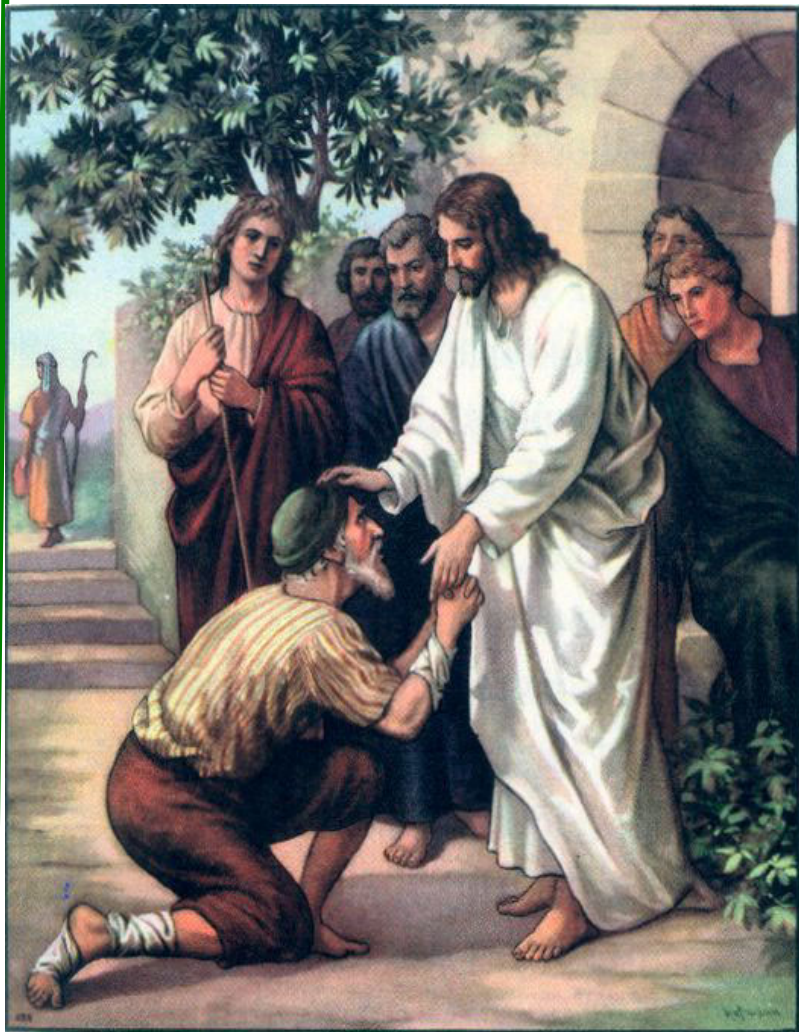

## LITURGY OF THE WORD

In the first reading, a man with a skin infection is deemed unclean and separated from the community. In Corinthians, Paul tells us to be imitators of Christ, and to do everything for the glory of God. In the Gospel, Jesus cures a leper, and then tells him not to speak of the healing to anyone.

## GIVE GOD THE GLORY

A curious feature of the first half of Mark's Gospel is the pattern of Jesus working a miracle, then telling the recipient of the miracle to keep still about it. Many theories have been offered: Mark is setting the stage for the great "secret" revealed when Peter will proclaim Jesus the Messiah at Caesarea Philippi; more skeptical commentators offer that Jesus, fully aware of human nature, knew that the way to spread the news was to tell people to keep it secret. The insight into this secret-keeping that serves us well, however, is that Jesus was initiating his public ministry according to the pattern that Paul describes. He was doing it for the glory of God—not for his own benefit, but for that of all. Paul would later write in Philippians that Jesus "humbled" himself to become like us. And we see this humility at work in today's healing of the leper. Jesus is trying to reveal the presence of God's reign among the people, not so that he himself might receive the glory, but so that God would be glorified through him. Imitating this pattern, which Paul encourages the Jewish and Greek Christian factions in Corinth to do, still serves us well today.

## Lenten Fasting Regulations

Abstinence on all the Fridays of Lent, and on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. No meat may be eaten on days of abstinence. Catholics 14 years and older are bound to abstain from meat. Invalids, pregnant and nursing mothers are exempt. Lent is a time of prayer, penance and almsgiving, intended to prepare us for the annual commemoration during Holy Week of Jesus' Passion, Death and Resurrection. These forty days can and should be a "springtime" for the soul: a time to rise from the death of sin and renew ourselves spiritually in preparation for the wondrous feast of Easter.

## Tajemnica miłości /2/

### Lepszy seks

„Pobożni katolicy żyjący w małżeństwie mają najlepsze życie seksualne ze wszystkich grup społecznych” — stwierdzają badacze z Family Research Council, Kiedy przeglądałem wyniki badań, wskazujących na to, że wiara chrześcijańska sprzyja budowaniu ekscytującej więzi małżeńskiej, postanowiłem zapytać o te kwestie dwie młode kobiety. Magdalena Siemion, autorka głośnej książki pt. „Teologia ciała. Seks według Jana Pawła II cię wyzwoli”, komentuje: — W ogóle mnie nie dziwią wyniki tych badań. Chrześcijańskie małżeństwo jest wyjątkowe z jednego, jedynego powodu: do miłości dwojga kochających się ludzi zapraszany jest Pan Bóg. To zmienia wszystko. Od tej chwili można powiedzieć, że jest ich trzech... jak Trójca Święta. A ponieważ Bóg jest wierny, kocha nas miłością całkowitą, ciągle owocującą, to nie dziwi, że małżeństwa, które faktycznie wchodzą z Nim w relację, też chcą tak kochać. A jak się kocha drugą osobę, to konsekwencją tego jest udane życie seksualne. Bardzo udane.

Katarzyna Waliczek, filozof i publicystka, ostrzega, żeby nie traktować chrześcijaństwa jako magicznego talizmanu gwarantującego sukces: — Chrześcijaństwo to coś więcej niż etyka, światopogląd czy styl życia. Tu chodzi o relację z Chrystusem! Nawet gdyby zawalił nam się cały świat, źródłem naszego szczęścia jest Bóg. I dodaje: — Są jednak pewne powody, dla których życie zgodne z wiarą chrześcijańską można uznać za czynnik zwiększający szanse na szczęśliwe małżeństwo. Pierwszy z nich jest oczywisty. Bóg sam jest Miłością, komunią Osób. Do kogo możemy się zwrócić po miłość, jeśli nie do Miłości wiecznej? Po drugie, chrześcijaństwo uczy, że w relacji chodzi o służbę drugiej osobie. Brzmi to dość rozsądnie, nawet z punktu widzenia osoby niewierzącej. Wiadomo, że osoba, którą kochamy, będzie się zmieniać. Z biegiem czasu może się okazać, że już nie posiada tego wszystkiego, na czym nam zależało — urody, zdrowia, pieniędzy, energii. Cdn..
