



LITURGY OF THE WORD

Our first reading relates the suffering and despair of Job. In the second reading, Saint Paul tells us we must not keep the Good News to ourselves, but we are called to share it with those we meet. In the Gospel, we hear that Jesus comes to bring healing and peace to all those he encounters.

TIRELESS DISCIPLESHIP

The stories we've been hearing these weeks come from the very first chapter of Mark, and they show us the public ministry of Jesus in its infancy. Today's account shows some of the strain or adjustment of his new life of preaching the reign of God, healing the sick, and casting out demons. Notice that after sunset, when darkness ended the workday, people brought the sick and possessed to Jesus. The following day he rose before dawn to get away by himself to pray, but to no avail. Simon Peter and the others don't just look for him, they pursue him, filled with the fervor that his ministry has incited. With the self-sacrificing example he gave until the end of his earthly life, he tells his followers that this is his whole purpose. Through Mark, he is also telling the early church, and he is telling us, that this is our purpose, our vocation: to be tireless in our pursuit of proclaiming the Good News, and in bringing the healing, reconciling touch of Christ to the world.

Tajemnica miłości

Używaj życia z niewiątą, którąś ukochał, po wszystkie dni marnego twoego życia, których ci Bóg użyczył pod słońcem" (Koh 9, 9a). „Znajduj radość w żonie młodości. Przemiła to łania i wdzięczna kozica, jej piersią upajaj się zawsze, w miłości jej stale czuj rozkosz!” (Prz 5, 18b-19). Tak Pismo Święte wychwala miłość i wierność w małżeństwie. Jednak współczesny świat zdaje się zapominać o tej radości, do której powołuje nas Pan Bóg. Swoboda seksualna i łatwy dostęp do pornografii wielu ludziom wydawały się kuszącą propozycją. Ostatecznie przyniosły ból, smutek i wiele rozczałowań. Gdy narasta fala rozwodów, zdrad i tzw. seksu bez zobowiązania, wiele osób zadaje sobie pytanie o to, jak odnaleźć prawdziwą miłość i budować trwałe, szczęśliwe małżeństwo.

Sekret szczęśliwych małżeństw

Liczne badania pokazują, że te małżeństwa, które modlą się razem każdego dnia, są najbardziej trwałe i stabilne. Drugim zwyczajem powszechnym wśród najszczęśliwszych małżeństw jest szybkie przebaczenie sobie po kłótni, tak aby konflikt nie przeciągał się na kolejny dzień.

W 2005 r. opublikowano wyniki badania przeprowadzonego przez Uniwersytet w Perth (Australia). Wnioski? Pobożni chrześcijanie mają lepsze życie seksualne od innych grup. Dr Andrew Cameron wyjaśnia: przedmałżeńskie stosunki wywołują w późniejszym małżeństwie obawy o niewierność i zmniejszenie intymności. Nasze badania pokazały także, że większe bezpieczeństwo, intymność i harmonia w chrześcijańskich małżeństwach tylko częściowo może być wyjaśniona przez to, że mniej chrześcijan ma wielu partnerów. I dodaje: światopogląd chrześcijański pozytywnie wpływa na relacje w czterech kwestiach — poczucia bezpieczeństwa, intymności, harmonii i porozumienia w kwestii ról płciowych. Małżeństwa chrześcijańskie są trwalsze i rozpadają się z powodu choroby czy biedy rzadziej niż małżeństwa osób niewierzących. Chrześcijanie są też zdecydowanie bardziej zadowoleni z życia niż ateisi czy nawet wyznawcy rozmaitych religii wschodnich.
