SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

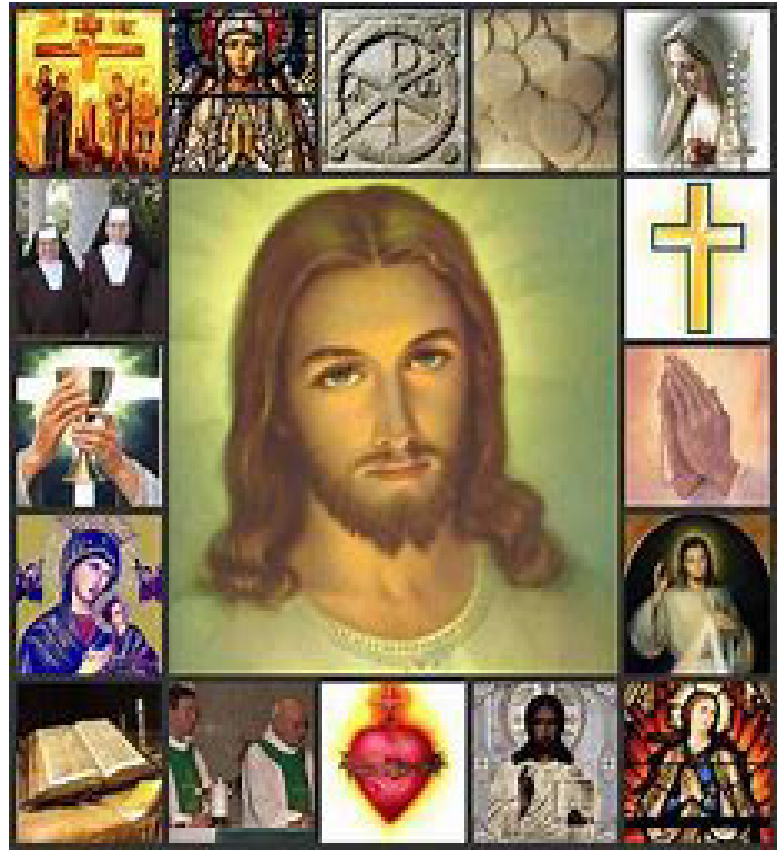

NOTE FROM FATHER MARIAN

This spring we need to make repairs on the roof of the church, which we estimate to be about **\$10,000.00**. We also have to register the cooling tower with the State and make repairs to the cooling tower for the air conditioning in the church which will cost about **\$ 8,000.00**. Sometime during the year we would like to make repairs to the parking lot and pave it, we estimate the cost between **\$45,000—\$60,000**. The second collection for the church improvement and repairs is being collected for these necessary repairs. Thank you for your support and generosity each week.

New LED lightbulbs were installed in the gymnasium and in the church, also new track lighting was installed above the center pews in the church. PSE&G will be sending us a rebate towards the new LED lightbulbs. In the future we should see a reduction in the electric bills with the new LED lighting.

LIVING BRANCHES

The Gospel and second reading for this Fifth Sunday of Easter emphasize the need for us to remain in Christ, and he in us. This shared life finds expression in the image of the one vine and many branches. We become living branches of the vine, members of the Body of Christ through baptism, Eucharist, and confirmation, sacraments of sharing God's own life. The First Letter of John describes the fruit of this vine as active love of neighbor: "And his commandment is this: we should believe .and love one another"

Our first reading from Acts shows us an example of someone who shares in Christ's life in the person of Saint Paul. Paul's fearless witness, even at the risk of his life, is proof to everyone that the risen Lord's Spirit truly fills him with life and is bearing fruit in him.

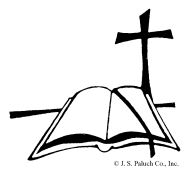

Czy grób Jezusa był pusty? /5/

Nietrudno sobie wyobrazić, że ewangelista, wiedząc o istnieniu niezwykle wizerunku na Całunie, chciał podkreślić, że w czasie Jezusowego pogrzebu płótno było czyste, a więc nie posiadało jeszcze żadnego wizerunku. Są to jedynie domysły, które jednak pokazują, iż Biblia nie wyklucza możliwości obecności w Grobie Pańskim Całunu Turyńskiego, chociaż też jednoznacznie tego nie potwierdza. Równie dobrze należałoby zapytać, co stało się z grobową chustą (*soudáron*), która spoczywała na głowie Jezusa. Spośród kilku rozsianych po świecie relikwii, pretendujących do miana Jezusowego *soudáron*, na szczególną uwagę zasługują dwie: Chusta z Oviedo w Hiszpanii, zawierająca duże plamy krwi zgodnej z tą z Całunu Turyńskiego, oraz Chusta z Manoppello we Włoszech, posiadająca tajemniczy, niemal fotograficzny wizerunek twarzy Chrystusa, czczony jako Święte Oblicze (*Volto Santo*). Obie chusty są komplementarne ze sobą oraz z Całunem, to znaczy posiadają takie same szczegóły, proporcje i kształty. Założenie obecności w grobie obu tych chust mogłoby dodatkowo pomóc wyjaśnić zjawisko, które Jan ujrzał, kiedy tam wszedł. Jeśli przyjmiemy, że zanim jeszcze owinięto ciało Jezusa w Całun Turyński, okręcono wokół Jego głowy Chustę z Oviedo w celu zatrzymania wypływu krwi z jamy ustnej, wówczas łatwiej możemy zrozumieć zjawisko „osobnej chusty”, o którym wspomina ewangelista. Otóż zgromadzona na tkaninie z Oviedo krew, zmieszana z wonnościami, których użyto do pogrzebu (zob. J 19,39-40), mogła skutecznie usztywnić materiał, przez co zachował on kształt głowy nawet po zniknięciu, a raczej przeniknięciu przezeń zmartwychwstałego Ciała Jezusa. Reszta Całunu i ewentualnych opasek naturalnie opadła, podczas gdy tkaniny w części głowy pozostały w swojej unikalnej niezmienniej pozycji. Przyjmując dodatkowo, że wierzchnią tkaniną grobową, umieszczoną na Całunie Turyńskim w miejscu twarzy Jezusa, była Chusta z Manoppello, możemy wyobrazić sobie wrażenie, jakie widok oblicza żyjącego Pana mógł wyrzucić na pogrążonym w żałobie umiłowanym uczniu. Słynna chusta „owinięta w jedynej pozycji” wyróżniałaby się nie tylko niepowtarzalnym sposobem ułożenia w kształcie głowy, ale także obecnością wizerunku, pozostawionego tam jako niezaprzeczalny dowód zmartwychwstania Chrystusa.
