LITURGY OF THE WORD

In poetic, metaphoric language, today's first reading tells of God's personal and tender love for his people. In the second reading, the author explains that his calling is to help the Gentiles know the love God has for them. In the Gospel, we hear that the soldiers do not break Jesus' legs, but do pierce his side – both of which occur so that the Scriptures may be fulfilled.

PROMISES

Today's liturgy is full of promises. The reading from Genesis promises a final triumph over the power of sin and a return to a new creation. The reading from Second Corinthians promises that all who follow Christ will have to struggle. It also promises, however, that we can persevere if we but recognize that Christ is within us, renewing us daily, and giving us the courage and the strength we need to endure. The Gospel promises that doing God's will makes us "family" with Jesus, who forgives all sin and triumphs over evil. Today might be a good day for us to make some promises as well. We can promise to stop kidding ourselves about our own tendencies to selfishness and sin. We can promise ourselves to believe—really believe—that while we are not sinless, we are forgiven. We can promise ourselves to combat evil and sin by acting as sisters and brothers not only to the Lord, but to one another as well.

Rola Maryi Królowej w dziejach

Narodu Polskiego.

Wyjątkowe w swoich dalekosiężnych skutkach okazały się wydarzenia związane z nawałnicą szwedzką i heroiczną obroną Jasnej Góry w końcowych miesiącach 1655 roku. Literacką wersję tych czasów przedstawił Henryk Sienkiewicz w *Potopie*, starając się „pokrzepić serca” swoich rodaków. W przeciwieństwie do ówczesnej publicystyki historycznej nie był pesymistą, choć wiedział, że sytuacja Rzeczypospolitej po kilkunastoletnich wojnach była niemal katastrofalna, i to we wszystkich dziedzinach życia, w gospodarce, ustroju politycznym, kulturze. Dlatego wołanie o wsparcie płynące z nieba stawało się w tych okolicznościach coraz silniejsze. Krytykował magnaterię odpowiedzialną w zasadzie za narodowe klęski, pozbawioną żaru patriotycznego, nastawioną egoistycznie, w przeciwieństwie do wielu wybitnych jednostek wywierających pozytywny wpływ na losy państwa. Zachęcał, że oprócz nadziei pokładanej w nowych układach politycznych należy zawierzyć Bogu, zwłaszcza oddać się pod opiekę Matki Jasnogórskiej.

Ta romantyczna z natury wizja znalazła szeroki oddźwięk wśród Polaków i do dzisiaj ma swoich solennych zwolenników. Jan Matejko, tworząc historyczny fresk *Śluby Jana Kazimierza*, umocnił ten optymistyczny obraz siedemnastowiecznej historii Polski; potwierdził znaczenie wiary i religii w ostatecznym zwycięstwie nad Szwedami. Podobnie uczynił, malując tryptyk *Królowa Korony Polskiej*, obraz w ścisłym sensie religijny, co u niego było rzadkością. Malowidło (dzisiaj zaginione) przedstawia procesję, podczas której tron Matki Bożej z Dzieciątkiem niosą królewicz Kazimierz i św. Jacek. Oprócz nich wśród tłumu postaci widzimy królową Jadwigę w otoczeniu dzieci i wielu innych świętych oraz bohaterów narodowych. Stało się więc coś niebywale fascynującego. * * * * *
