Rola Maryi Królowej w dziejach

Narodu Polskiego.

Oto Maryja, pełna łask, wskazująca na swojego Syna, znalazła najbardziej godne i pierwsze miejsce w sercach Polaków wszystkich stanów. Szczególnie jednak we wrażliwości zwykłych ludzi, odznaczających się prostą, „ludową wiarą”, ale bardzo gorącą, zaangażowaną, uwidacznianą w gestach liturgicznej pobożności.

Matejko stał się w ten sposób niejako nowym profetycznym „Królem-Duchem” polskiego narodu, sławiącym jego bohaterskie dzieje, zapowiadającym przyszłe odrodzenie kraju, a w szerszej perspektywie umacniał przekonanie o tym, że dobro ostatecznie pokonuje wszelkie zło, jak to sugeruje *Bitwa pod Grunwaldem*. Nie dziwi przeto, że sławiono Bogarodzicę publicznie i w modlitwach prywatnych, pisano niezliczone kantyczki, wiersze, piosenki. Najwięksi twórcy wznosili się na niebywałe poziomy „teologii literackiej i malarskiej”, gruntując obecność Maryi w powszechnej świadomości Polaków.

POLSKA — KRÓLESTWEM MARYI

Tę scenę pamiętała i zapewne pamięta obecnie większość mieszkańców Rzeczypospolitej. Jest kwiecień 1656 roku. W katedrze lwowskiej król Jan Kazimierz w obecności obrazu Matki Boskiej Łaskawej schodzi z tronu, składa berło i koronę, pada na kolana i przed ołtarzem ślubuje: „Wielka Boga Człowieka Matko, Najświętsza Dziewico. Ja, Jan Kazimierz, za zmiłowaniem Syna Twojego, Króla królów, a Pana mego i Twoim miłosierdziem król, do Najświętszych stóp Twoich przypadszy, Ciebie dziś za Patronkę moją i za Królową państw moich obieram. Tak samego siebie, jak i moje Królestwo i wszystkie moje ludy Twojej osobliwej opiece i obronie polecam, Twojej pomocy i zlitowania w tym kłęk pełnym i oplakany Królestwa mego stanie przeciw nieprzyjaciołom Rzymskiego Kościoła pokornie przyzywam”. Czyni to w warunkach wręcz dramatycznych: trwała okupacja szwedzka, nasilały się bunty kozackie, niebezpieczeństwo wzmagaly anarchia spowodowana liberum veto, zakusy Tatarów i Turków, krystalizowały się też zagrożenia ze strony prawosławnej Rosji.

Wydawało się więc czymś właściwym oddanie się w opiekę Matki Boskiej, co byłoby wyraźnym gestem jednoczącym Polaków, którzy poza Lwowem i Częstochową nie dysponowali żadnym wolnym skrawkiem ziemi. Cdn.
