LITURGY OF THE WORD

In the first reading, we hear that God calls and forms his servants from the womb. The reading from Acts speaks of those whom God raised up to do his work, including John the Baptist. In Luke's Gospel, Elizabeth gives birth and proclaims that the boy's name will be John.

JOHN THE BAPTIST

Since June 24 falls on a Sunday this year, the Church has the opportunity for a more intense celebration of the birth of John the Baptist, who is often described as the last of the Old Testament prophets and the bridge between Judaism and Christianity. More commonly, John is known as the "precursor" of our Lord Jesus Christ. All the Gospels report John's basic message: Repent, the kingdom is near at hand. One greater than I is coming. Though he was a wandering preacher who dressed in camel skins and ate grasshoppers, John's legacy is one of true royalty. His origins are similar to those foretold by God through the prophet Isaiah: "You are my servant, he said to me, Israel through whom I show my glory" (Isaiah 49:3). John's humility—"I am not he"—was surpassed only by that of his Lord Jesus, the humble servant who followed.

Rola Maryi Królowej w dziejach

Narodu Polskiego.

Wydawało się więc czymś właściwym oddanie się w opiekę Matki Boskiej, co byłoby wyraźnym gestem jednoczącym Polaków, którzy poza Lwowem i Częstochową nie dysponowali żadnym wolnym skrawkiem ziemi. I właśnie dzięki lwowskim ślubom zaczął się pogłębiać kult Chrystusa jako Boga-Człowieka i Najświętszej Marii Panny. Historycznie ważnym faktem było to, że w tym czasie nuncjusz papieski Piotr Vidoni w pobliskim kościele jezuitów po raz pierwszy, wypowiadając słowa *Litanii loretańskiej*, włączył doń wezwanie „Królowo Korony Polskiej, módl się za nami”. Mnożą się obrazy Matki Bożej, uznawane za cudowne przez wszystkie nacje religijne i warstwy społeczne, zarówno łacińskie, jak i unickie. Ale najwięcej chwały odbiera obraz jasnogórski, zwłaszcza po obronie przed Szwedami w 1655 roku, stając się szeroko rozpoznawalnym symbolem tożsamości oraz jedności narodowej. Wobec tego czym był ów akt oddania, do czego zobowiązywał, jakie wzbudzał oczekiwania i tęsknoty?

Odpowiedź wcale nie jest łatwa. W każdym razie okazał się przede wszystkim źródłem kolejnych liturgicznych zawierzeń, modlitw, hołdów składanych Królowej Polski. Ale też przyniósł pewne korzyści w sferze polityczno-społecznej. Od tego momentu Polska — podobnie jak Francja, Portugalia, Państwo Habsburgów czy Węgry — formalnie zyskała status królestwa Maryi i w osobie króla i całego społeczeństwa przyjęła duchowe Jej rządy. Oficjalna władza miała po prostu sprawować swoje funkcje w Jej imieniu. A kiedy w 1717 roku „Czarną Madonnę” ukoronowano koronami papieskimi, a po odzyskaniu niepodległości w 1920 roku ustanowiono osobne święto Matki Bożej Królowej Polski, trudno już było sobie wyobrazić życie Polaków bez trwałej więzi z Matką Chrystusa. Wierni nadal wędrują do Częstochowy i innych miejsc pielgrzymkowych, uciekają się do Maryi we wszystkich trudnych sprawach egzystencji i potrzebach, nie tylko zresztą z powodów psychologicznych, jak do Matki, kogoś najbardziej czułego, ale zasadniczo jako do Tej, która odgrywa ważną rolę w dziele zbawienia człowieka. Uwielbiając Maryję, będącą Pośredniczką wszelkich łask, Matką Kościoła, Niepokalaną Poczetą .
