## **LITURGY OF THE WORD**

In our reading from Exodus, Moses and the people commit to the Lord and his covenant. In Hebrews, the author uses the image of a mediator in describing Jesus' role in the new covenant we have with the Father. The Gospel recalls the first Eucharistic meal.

## **PRECIOUS BLOOD**

On this solemnity we focus our attention on the Body and Blood of Christ. We listen to the story of the renewal of the old covenant, which Moses sealed by splashing the blood of animals on the altar of sacrifice, as well as on the people. Jesus, whose blood is the blood of the new covenant, shed that precious blood on the cross, saving us from sin and promising us everlasting life. Blood is the life source that courses through our bodies. The precious blood of Christ is the life source for our spirits. Today may we, like the psalmist, offer a sacrifice of thanksgiving to the Lord, whose Body and Blood strengthen us to bring the Good News to everyone we meet.

## **TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

The origins of today's solemnity lie in thirteenth-century Belgium. In those days, people seldom received Holy Communion, and never from the chalice. A nun in a troubled convent, Juliana of Liège, devoted her life to stirring up love for the Eucharist, lobbying for a feast day to honor the Blessed Sacrament with Masses and processions. Juliana may have been inspired by the Ascension Day processions in nearby Bruges. Crusaders brought a treasure home to Bruges from Constantinople in 1204: a reliquary said to contain a cloth from Joseph of Arimathea with which he had helped prepare the body of Jesus for burial. The stain on the cloth was said to be the holy blood itself, and so the people of Bruges built a great basilica to house the relic. Bruges became a great center of pilgrimage because of this treasure, and the procession of the Holy Blood is still one of the greatest festivals in Belgium today. The bishop carries the relic through the narrow streets, and the people wear medieval costumes and act out scenes from the Bible.

### Rola Maryi Królowej w dziejach narodu polskiego.

Książę Władysław Opolczyk, namiestnik na Rusi króla węgierskiego Ludwika, sprowadził paulinów z Węgier i w 1382 lub 1384 z Bełzu obraz Matki Bożej do Częstochowy. Niebawem stał się on narodową ikoną, sygnałem jedności państwa, wyrazem konfesyjnej ortodoksji. Przynależał do znacznego zestawu wizerunków, których pierwowzór znajdował się w Konstantynopolu, gdzie zwano go *Hodegetria*, co znaczyło „Ta, co wskazuje drogę”. Bo rzeczywiście na tym przedstawieniu Maryja wskazuje prawą dłoń Chrystusa, który wszak powiedział o sobie, że jest „drogą, prawdą i życiem”. Jest więc Przewodniczką ku Zbawicielowi świata, a także znakiem opieki Bożej nad państwem. W ten sposób maryjność bezpośrednio poświadczająca chrystocentryzm doktryny chrześcijańskiej. Takie same funkcje zaczęła spełniać w Polsce jej kopia umieszczona w sanktuarium jasnogórskim. Ale nie tylko. Podczas wojen przed tą Świętą Podobizną, przesiąkniętą łagodnym smutkiem i od pewnego czasu z dwoma cięciami po prawej stronie twarzy, składano sztandary, vota, wyrazy wdzięczności i hołdu. Porządek polityczny zespolił się więc w pewien sposób z porządkiem religijnym. Sprawy Kościoła stały się odtąd nieodłączną częścią społeczno-politycznego krajobrazu. Najprawdopodobniej Grzegorz z Sambora (1523-1573) w łacińskim poemacie *Częstochowa*, przedstawiając dzieje obrazu Matki Boskiej Częstochowskiej, nazwał Maryję Królową Polski i Polaków, natomiast Maciej Kazimierz Sarbiewski, „chrześcijański Horacy”, jak go wtedy nazywano, w kilkadziesiąt lat później w swoich utworach rozpowszechnił ideę znamiennej opieki Maryi nad Polską, określając ją mianem Wielkiej Polski Obrończyni (*magna Poloniae Tutela*). W połowie XVII wieku mówiono i pisano już powszechnie o Maryi jako Królowej Polski.
