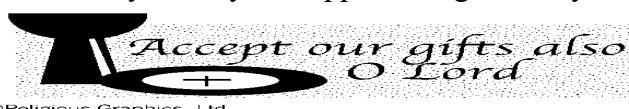

#### **NOTHING TO FEAR**

A rabbi was asked why God sends trials and troubles into human lives. "Because God gets lonely for his people" was the reply. There is some resonance with this wisdom in today's Gospel, as Jesus makes his disciples get into a boat without him and goes off alone while they venture into stormy waters. Of course, neither Jews nor Christians believe that the Almighty plays this sort of whimsical game with them, but there is some truth in the statement that we don't turn to God for saving help until we're in a bind. Peter's role today, as it is throughout the New Testament, is to be a sign or to represent each member of the church and the whole church. Our story is the tale told about Peter's faith today. What can bolster our faith is that even when Christ calls us to face bravely the tempests of life, if we are walking through them with our eyes fixed on him in faith, we have nothing to fear. Even when we falter or sink, simply crying "Lord, save me!" is enough to help us know the steady grasp of God's hand. Then, sheltered inside the walls of faith, the storms we endure lose their power over us.

##### **The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary**

Today's solemnity invites us to recall and remember the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary body and soul into heaven. This event speaks to us in a number of important ways, one of which is to offer us hope: Where Mary has gone, we hope to follow. Let's strive to always say "yes" to God that we might be judged worthy of eternal life.

The first reading tells of a great sign appearing in the sky: a woman clothed with the sun. The second reading reminds us that *just as in Adam all die, so too in Christ shall all be brought to life*. In the Gospel, Mary travels to a town in Judah to visit her kinswoman, Elizabeth, who was with child.

## 15 sierpnia

### a-święto Kościoła i Wojska Polskiego

Święto Wojska Polskiego to święto Sił Zbrojnych Rzeczypospolitej Polskiej, obchodzone na pamiątkę zwycięskiej bitwy warszawskiej 15 sierpnia 1920 r., stoczonej w czasie wojny polsko-bolszewickiej. Była to wojna zakończona traktatem ryskim, w którym ostatecznie ustalono wschodnią granicę Polski. Wojna ta nie tylko umocniła międzynarodową pozycję Polski, ale także pokazała, że broniący Ojczyzny żołnierze mogą liczyć na ofiarność i odwagę cywili. Najlepszym przykładem patriotycznej postawy cywilnej ludności jest postać księdza Skorupki poległego 14 sierpnia 1920 pod Warszawą. Obecnie 15 sierpnia na cmentarzach pamięć żołnierzy ze wszystkich wojen czci Apel Poległych, natomiast przed Grobem Nieznanego Żołnierza w Warszawie odbywa się Honorowa Zmiana Warty.

15 sierpnia - Wniebowzięcie Matki Bożej, nazywane w tradycji polskiej Świętem Matki Boskiej Zielnej. W całym kraju święto to jest obchodzone bardzo uroczyście, jednak największe obchody mają miejsce w Kalwarii Zebrzydowskiej, odbywają się tam inscenizacje Zaśnięcia Maryi oraz jej Wniebowzięcia. Na Jasną Górę przybywają właśnie na to święto pielgrzymki z całej Polski. Dla osoby wierzącej zbieżność tego ważnego święta ze zwycięstwem Polski w przełomowej Bitwie Warszawskiej nie jest przypadkowa. To kolejne potwierdzenie, że Maryja naprawdę jest Królową Polski i jako Królowa nieustannie otacza ją swoją opieką. To właśnie w wigilię tego święta swoje życie oddali czciciele Maryi: św. Maksymilian Maria Kolbe i ks. Ignacy Skorupka, a ich ofiara wydała plon stokrotny. Dla całego świata to święto jest też potwierdzeniem, że Ona zawsze wstawia się za opuszczonymi, za ofiarami agresji.
