## **2018 MASS BOOK WILL OPEN TUESDAY AUGUST 22, 2017**

### **LITURGY OF THE WORD**

The first reading speaks of God's gift of salvation being offered to all people. The second reading reminds us that the gifts and call of God are irrevocable. In the Gospel, Jesus heals the daughter of a Canaanite woman because of the woman's great faith in him.

### **CALLED TO ACT IN GOD'S NAME**

"Let all the nations praise you!" (Psalm 67:4) today's psalm response exclaims. In the psalms and other Hebrew scriptures, this kind of invocation is actually an invitation to God to act, to intervene in human lives in a manner that will cause everyone—not just the Chosen People—to give praise. Stated a bit more strongly, it is something of a "put up or shut up" challenge to God, the sort of strong statement the psalmists of Israel, trusting in their intimate and loving relationship with God, were not afraid to make.

The Gospel has its own exclamation, announcing the appearance of the Canaanite woman with "Behold!" (Matthew 15:22) "Behold!" is a scriptural flag that tells us that God is about to act or announce something through an individual or a situation. In the case of Jesus, God was going to act through this woman, whom nobody among Jesus' followers would have believed to be an agent of the divine will. Like the psalmists, we might passively inform or perhaps even actively challenge God to do something so that everyone will come to belief, but God will always turn the tables on us. It becomes our calling, our duty (as it was for Jesus) to behold the situations and persons of our daily lives so that God can act through us, so the Kingdom can be announced through our living.

## 20 sierpnia

W tym tygodniu obchodzimy wspomnienie św. Izabeli Flores de Oliva bardziej znanej jako św. Róży z Limy. Urodzona już w Nowym Świecie, jest pierwszą Peruwianką ogłoszoną świętą. Należała do Trzeciego Zakonu św. Dominika. Pierwszym gałąź męska zakonu, drugim gałąź żeńska – w obu tych zakonach składane są śluby czystości, posłuszeństwa i ubóstwa. Trzeci zakon jest zaś przeznaczony dla osób świeckich-albo inaczej-żyjących w świecie. Są to więc żony/matki, mężowie/ojcowie prowadzący życie zawodowe. Ich przynależność do zakonu objawia się na różne sposoby: codzienne uczestnictwo we mszy, regularny różaniec, spotkania w ramach fraterni, czyli bractwa najczęściej funkcjonującego przy najbliższym klasztorze dominikańskim. Tradycją jest też, że tercjarze po śmierci składani są do grobu w habitie zakonnym i tak też są przedstawiani w ikonografii. Dlatego możemy sobie nie zdawać sprawy, że święty, czy święta przedstawieni na obrazie jako dominikanie w rzeczywistości byli ludźmi świeckimi żyjącymi w świecie i w świecie realizowali ideały świętego Dominika.

Do najbardziej znanych dominikańskich tercjarzy, oprócz św. Róży z Limy należą: św. Katarzyna ze Sieny, Służebnica Boża Paulina Jaricot, założycielka Żywego Różańca, bł. Piotr Jerzy Frassati, Zofia Kossak-Szczucka, Aldo Moro, św. Ludwik Maria Grignon de Montfort. Oprócz tych bardziej znanych postaci, do tercjarzy należało wielu świętych męczenników narodowości japońskiej i wietnamskiej.

Istnieje oczywiście także Trzeci Zakon Św. Franciszka, do którego należeli: Elżbieta Aragońska (królowa Portugalii), Bernadeta Soubirous, Aniela Salawa, św. Ferdynand III -król Kastylii, św. Ludwik IX -król Francji.

Na zakończenie chciałbym podziękować za wspólnie spędzone wakacyjne tygodnie. Szczęść Boże.
