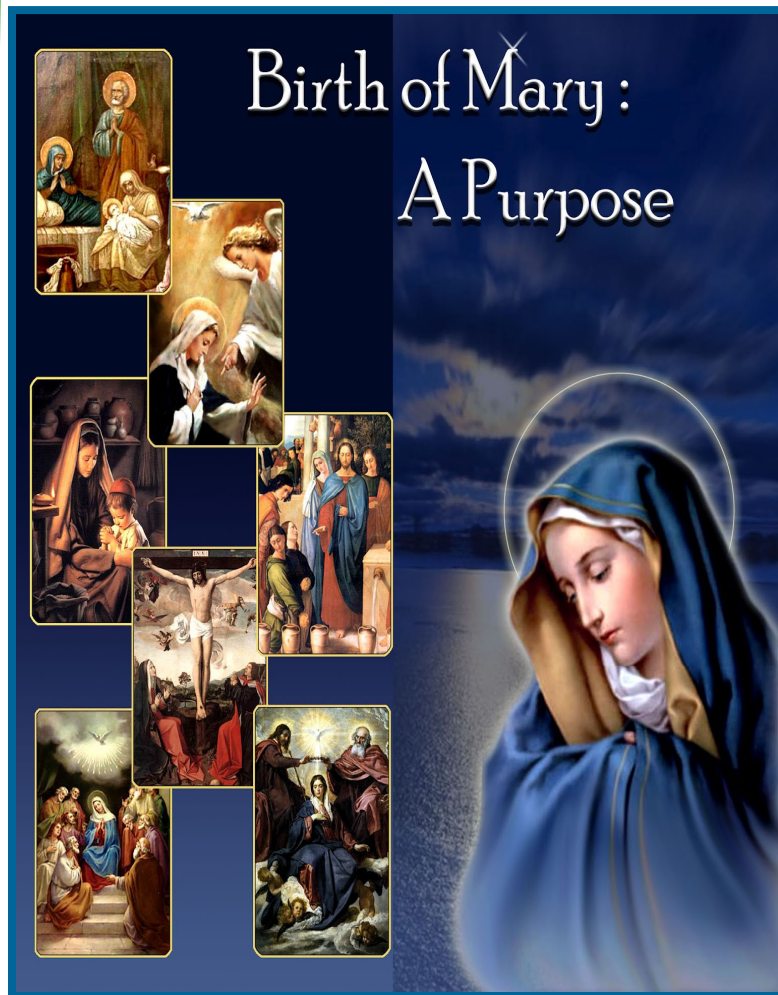
SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

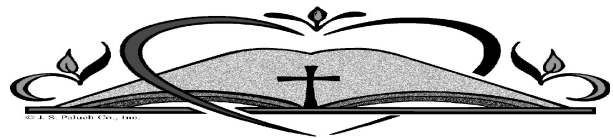

LITURGY OF THE WORD

The first reading tells of the inner struggles Jeremiah experienced in being faithful to God's call to serve as a prophet. The second reading exhorts us to lead lives that are holy and pleasing to God. In the Gospel, Jesus teaches that all who desire to live as one of his disciples must take up their cross and follow him.

FOLLOWING CHRIST

If you've ever had an unpleasant but somewhat amusing practical joke played on you, then you have some understanding of how Jeremiah feels today when he tells God “good one—you duped me.” We can almost see him shaking his head with a bit of a rueful smile, but an angry undertone in his voice. In similar fashion, Peter thinks Jesus is “duping” him when Jesus starts to explain that being Messiah means suffering and dying, and being a follower of the Messiah means taking up a cross and doing the same. Jeremiah tries to deny God's will for him by trying to shut up; Peter—who has just been made the foundation of the church—out and out denies the teaching of Jesus, for which he is named “Satan” today. Fortunately for us, Jeremiah comes to realize that to have the word of God placed in your heart means that it will be futile to try and keep silent, even if it means scorn and derision from those around you. Luckily Peter ultimately returned to the faith he professed in last week's Gospel, and came to understand our need as baptized followers of Christ to follow in his way, even when it means following him to our very death.

Please bear with us while the air conditioning system in the church is being repaired.

We have been notified by the Diocese that air conditioning systems with cooling towers must be registered with New York State. Due to this regulation updates must be made to our system.

The Diocese has retained Gotham Refining Chemical Corporation to maintain the cooling towers for the few parishes in the diocese with this type of cooling system. Gotham Refining Chemical Corporation will sanitize and chemically treat the cooling towers. It will cost the parish \$1,975.00 plus installation to bring the tower up to code, plus it will cost the parish \$3,600.00 per year for the Cooling Tower Maintenance, Inspection, Cleaning, Sanitizing and Chemical Application to the Cooling Tower for protection against Legionella.

In two weeks the work will begin on the front wall of the Church and the west side wall of the bell tower. The contractor will re-point the bricks, which will prevent the heavy rain from leaking into the choir loft and the basement of the church. Please bear with us while the work is being done. NOWE KORONY DLA KRÓLOWEJ POLSKI

To dla mnie wielki honor, że mogłem się włączyć w to jubileuszowe świętowanie.

Tymi koronami nie tyle upiększyłem Matkę Bożą, bo Ona była już cała piękna, ile mam nadzieję, że dodały Jej one blasku — powiedział włoski mistrz złotnictwa Michele Affidato. Z okazji jubileuszu 300-lecia koronacji Cudownego Obrazu Matki Bożej Częstochowskiej powstały nowe korony, stanowiące replikę koron papieża Klemensa XI sprzed 300 lat (skradzione w 1909 r.). **Nowe, ale stare korony** Z racji jubileuszu zrodził się pomysł rekonstrukcji koron подарowanych przez Klemensa XI. Nowe korony pobłogosławił papież Franciszek 17 maja br. na Placu św. Piotra w Rzymie. Ojcowie paulini zdecydowali, że zostaną one nałożone na Obraz Jasnogórski 28 lipca, dokładnie w 1. rocznicę pielgrzymki papieża Franciszka na Jasną Górę. — Pomyśleliśmy, że w rocznicę pobytu Franciszka na Jasnej Górze nałożymy te korony, by upamiętnić papieskie pielgrzymowanie — podkreślił o. Marian Waligóra, przeor Jasnej Góry. W pierwszą rocznicę pielgrzymki Franciszka Uroczystej Mszy św. przewodniczył abp Wacław Depo, metropolita częstochowski. Koncelebrowali: arcybiskup senior Stanisław Nowak i bp Andrzej Przybylski z Częstochowy, a także generał Zakonu Paulinów o. Arnold Chrapkowski i o. Marian Waligóra z całym konwentem jasnogórskim. Przybyło wielu kapłanów z różnych stron Polski i świata, w tym rektor bazyliki w Crotone — Don Serafino Parisi i rektor sanktuarium Matki Bożej Capocolonna — Don Bernardino Mongelluzzi. Obecni byli przedstawiciele diecezji Crotone — fundatorzy koron, a wśród nich Michele Affidato, mistrz złotnictwa, wykonawca koron. Przed rokiem kolejny następca św. Piotra — Ojciec Święty Franciszek, stojąc na tym miejscu, jak sam powiedział, odebrał „dar spojrzenia Matki”, a następnie, mówiąc do nas na Eucharystii przed Szczytem, podkreślił Jej konkretność i bliskość — tej Matki, którą otrzymaliśmy z wysokości krzyża jako „przedziwną pomoc i obronę” — powiedział na początku Mszy św. abp Depo. **Dar dla Matki Bożej.** W homilii, wygłoszonej w językach polskim i włoskim, o. gen. Chrapkowski przypomniał ubiegłoroczną wizytę Franciszka na Jasnej Górze. Nawiązał do 300. rocznicy koronacji Cudownego Obrazu Matki Bożej oraz inicjatywy „Żywa Korona Maryi”.
